- 2. The Study will be bilingual (English & Russian) and it should be completed within six weeks from the date of acceptance of the bid or proposal.
- 3. Interested parties with sound financial background and experience in undertaking market studies are required to submit technical and financial bids in two separate envelopes. In the prequalification stage, only the technical bids will be opened and examined and in the second stage, the financial bids will be opened, only of those who fulfill the technical requirements.
- 4. Parties that are applying should have at least 05 years of experience in undertaking market studies and must submit the following documents as part of technical bid:
 - a) Detailed profile mentioning registration detail, technical expertise and experience in conducting market studies
 - b) Copy of similar contract/s already executed
 - c) Copy of sample report of market study already conducted
